The GPC met at St Margaret S.E village hall on 8th January at 7.30.pm. Cllr Ffrench-Mullen recounted an incident when a taxi became stuck in a flood, to which an ambulance and two fire engines attended, it was agreed that better signage might reduce the amount of vehicles falling foul of this hazard.

Cllr Warne advised the council, that the signs were up for the Flixton pedestrian crossing, on the B1062, thanks in part to a donation of £1,240 from Breedon Gravel company. He also said what a good job the residents had made of clearing out the culvert by St Marys Close. St Cross had a sinkhole, this was being reported to the relevant people.

FROM THE TRACTOR SEAT

Despite the heavy rains, the days are getting longer, things should improve. The ducks are paired up as are many other birds and animals, it's not just plants that spring means new growth to. It's still a bit early for our migrating visitors, such as swifts, swallows, turtle doves and cuckoos. Meanwhile the magpies and jays are looking for nests to rob or eat the young. They are quite capable of working a hedge clearing it as they go. This is the time of year that the hares will be seen 'boxing', which is all part of the mating game. The young are called leverets and are born ready to go, once a day, usually at sunset, they are to be fed by their mother, otherwise they receive no parental care in the first 4 weeks of their life, normal lifespan is about 4 years.

Whether the mild weather we have been experiencing will mean the migrating birds will come earlier is something we will have to wait and see. Several plants are muddled as we have not had a cold spell, to prompt their systems to activate. Some are in bud too early. We can still have a sharp frost even snow, as the saying goes 'nae cast a clout before May is out', which has several translations one is 'don't take your vest off before May'.

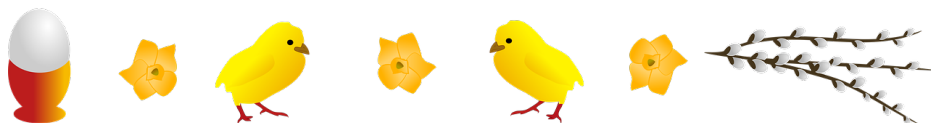

ROADS AND FLOODS

The weather conditions have inevitably had consequences for the roads. Due to the saturated land and constantly high water levels in the Beck, the flooding on Sandy Lane has occurred after every period of sustained rain- fall. Suffolk County Council have closed the road during flooding in an attempt to reduce the number of vehicles becoming stranded in flood waters and the follow-on cost of emergency service call outs.

Drivers should be aware that if road closed signage is ignored and your vehicle is damaged, your insurance company is unlikely pay.

Parish councillors and David Hill met with representatives of Suffolk County Council Highways and the Environment Agency to discuss solutions to the flooding on the corner by The Blacksmith's Workshop. As a result of this meeting the necessary ditches will be cleared which will avoid this flooding recurring. It is anticipated that this work will be carried out in the next 3 months and may involve road closure or traffic management during the works.

David has done a lot of work to try to clear areas of flooding on our village roads and is due a big vote of thanks for all his efforts.

A further site meeting between concerned residents, Parish Councillors and County Councillor Judy Cloke took place to draw attention to the state of our roads in the village. The number of large potholes was discussed and also the encroachment of traffic, particularly farm vehicles onto the grass

verges. There are areas of grass verge in the village which have been transformed into churned mud. County Councillor Cloke has requested an assessment from Suffolk County Council Highway department.

The Adair Room was pretty full and it was great to see long standing residents, new residents, young residents and old come together to look at ways of improving our village through greater involvement. Although a fair degree of time was spent on problems with road water drain- age, let's hope it's given more villagers a picture of what the issues are facing this community, how they are being handled and also how we might be able to improve things through local action.

We now have the prospect of getting some material and training support from Suffolk County Council by taking on a Community Self Help proposal. By now, there are nominations for safety training which should see us better equipped to tackle some of the problems our village faces. Thanks must go to Stewart Tilbury, Terry Hunt, Vanessa Wincup and Malcolm Mackinnon for volunteering. Luke has also offered his help, which has always been there when needed in the past.

Following on from the meeting Parish Councill, Ken Warne, who attended, has taken on several individual aspects regarding road drainage which should help local action.

During the meeting, representatives of the newly commenced project to re- store and recover for public display the remaining buildings from RAF Bungay, our Flixton Air Base presented an outline plan for the future. Most will know RAF Bungay as the US airbase which operated large B24 Liberator bombers of the 446th Bomb Group in WW2. The representatives gave a brief talk on what they are hoping to achieve and also how many visitors the project may bring in to the local area. The primary site for their work is just behind Grange Farm. There will be follow-up meetings, the next one on 16th May, enabling us to develop a medium to long term plan. Clearly, there are many views on how our village could improve and to that end, Flixton residents should find a questionnaire with this copy of the Community News. Please take a few moments to help us build up a better picture of what might be worth tackling.

Key dates for now are 6th April, Litter Pick, all volunteers welcome. 16th April Annual Parish Meeting. On the 9th May, at the village hall, there is the chance to enjoy "sound bathing" aimed at relaxing our stressed bodies and minds. Obviously it's difficult for people to understand why one individual would behave in this way but when your life is so self-absorbed you're not going to change without being forced to. It's time for the village to ensure every available enforcement action is applied.

THE AVIATION MUSEUM & EAST COAST PIRATES EVENT

Over some years there have been issues with how the museum interacts with the village it has made it's home. Since we moved here in 1994, the village and the museum have coexisted pretty well and it was always a nice local place to visit when out for a walk or when we had the odd hour to go over and chat with the volunteers. We frequently donated things for them to sell in their hangar shop. That situation began to change when the museum came under new stewardship. It became, for us, a less welcoming place to be. I remember Philip Murray not enjoying a good working relationship with them. So, we rarely visit now.

Just after Christmas I sat with the museum manager and a local trustee at a meeting which the museum called to discuss things with Gary and Linda at the Buck. The meeting seemed to go ok, with Linda repeating her 2023 commitment to provide Easter Eggs for the museum's 2024 Easter Egg hunt. The East Coast Pirates Event was discussed, as it had caused so much disruption to the whole of Flixton in 2023. The view stated to the museum representatives was that events around and over pub land were welcome providing that the pub did not suffer financially and preferably, increased its takings on the day. A very reasonable position. I agreed to attend a meeting between the Museum and the East Coast Pirates representatives when they set a date. A meeting was arranged.

Sadly, the meeting didn't take place. A cancellation phone call came through from the museum manager, due to him “double booking”.

But East Coast Pirates clearly got their "wrong impression" from somewhere. The museum, which has more recently continued to approach the relationship with the pub and the village in a quite dismissive way. The museum receives the Community News, could have attended our 15th February meeting, just as other local businesses and projects did, but it chooses not to interact with the village. This doesn't help the village, the pub or the museum.
