

Santa and Ronnie were there to distribute the presents. Glenn Earl was declared the winner of the 'Sam and Jean Earl Community Person of the Year'. Chris Sadler former village hall Chairman and long-time treasurer was presented with a retirement gift. Many thanks to Philip Sands for donating the turkeys. The Fun quiz in November was won by 4+2, a close competition. This year's carol service had a surprise, as at the close the congregation were treated to Jingle Bells on Hand Bells that have only just come to light after many years, thanks to Gail Sprake for arranging this musical extravaganza. The celebrants on Christmas Eve were treated to a repeat performance. A couple of days before Christmas Day, after dark, Santa was seen on his sleigh being pulled by Ronnie the reindeer, children and a several adults turned out in the strong wind to receive presents, as they all said 'they had been good', from the bearded gentleman, before he disappeared into the night. The Christmas party was rocking with the hall full and the bands in full swing, it's rumoured there may be a Summer one. The weather might be somewhat inclement, but not bad enough to stop such determined people as Sue Glazer, Maggie Flatt and James Graham, running through and round the floods. FROM THE TRACTOR SEAT

Even the birds don't like all this rain unless they are wildfowl. My bird feeder is a busy place with blue tits, great tits, robins, black birds, chaffinches, woodpeckers and on the ground is an occasional pigeon and at least twice a day a cock pheasant checks to see what food is available. The ones that arrive in a flock are the long-tailed tits, about 10 of them, gorging themselves on suet ball and peanuts, although my bird book says they only eat insects, like anything else they eat what is there. Along the Beck it was related to me that as the flood waters expanded there were in the 50s/100s of water voles scampering about. Likewise on the bridges were no end of spiders and other insects just above the waterline. Despite the wet weather Bluetongue virus is still being spread by midges. The infected midge believed to come across the channel, whether they came over on one of the small boats, I don't know. Unfortunately it's here and the virus affects cattle, sheep, deer, goats and camelids such as llamas. Smaller and younger infected animals suffer a slow and painful death if not spotted, in the larger ones not always, but it is a legally notifiable disease to DEFA, if you do not report it, you are breaking the law. The last time it was in this country was 2007. The affected animal is humanely culled to minimise the risk of onward transmission. There is no risk to human health from Bluetongue. At present the disease is in Kent and Norfolk with 10km no movements areas.

CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL

The Christmas Tree Festival had 13 decorated trees on display, a brilliant display of gorgeous lights. A bit of drama when a member of the clergy went off-roading and got stuck and although foggy, many people came on both days to see the paths all lit with Christmas lights. The tombola was busy, followed by tea, coffee or the special hot chocolate with marshmallows. Cakes to eat or buy and you can still find the elves. Thanks to all those who supported and worked tirelessly on the days.



ST JAMES VILLAGE GREEN

In November 2019 we suggested to East Suffolk Council (ESC) that they give the field they owned to the west of St James Lane, between the Village Hall and Sheet Field Wood, to St James. This would save them the cost of maintaining it (usually done by us anyway) and enable us to look after and improve it for the benefit of the village.

In August 2020 ESC offered the freehold to St James at no charge and in November with ESC Cabinet approval work on the transfer contract began.

St James continued...

In June 2021 our Parish Meeting AGM agreed that the field would be a significant new asset for the village and voted unanimously to proceed with transferring ownership when terms were agreed. The field would be known as The St James Village Green.

The COVID epidemic rather slowed the process, and some unexpected legal issues had to be dealt with. One was the need for our Parish Meeting formally to acquire the power to own land. This was achieved in January 2023 when, under the Common Seal of East Suffolk Council, ESC conferred on St James South Elmham Parish Meeting "the function of a parish council to acquire and hold land for the purposes of general community use".

Finally, on 18th December 2023 the legal transfer was completed and the land for the St James Village Green became "ours". [The St James South Elmham Parish Meeting comprises all electors of the parish].

Meanwhile, we have begun work on developing and using the Green, helped by a grant from The National Lottery Fund. This included using it for our two recent major celebrations: the Platinum Jubilee in 2022 and the Coronation Celebration last year. We were successful in bidding for a Jubilee Oak from ESC for the Jubilee event which was planted in 2022 at the head of the Green, and at the end of last year we were given 500 daffodil bulbs by ESC which have been planted in various places around the Green. We have also removed the large mound of dangerous waste in the NW corner and re-seeded the area. Our thanks to all who have helped in these activities. More improvements, facilities and events will come in 2024. Our new Village Green is already becoming part of St James village life.


