KICK UP A STINK!

Why is it that the same people are active supporting the village and others just don't care one bit?

This village has enough adverse issues caused by speeding vehicles and litter droppers passing through. It should not have to put up with problems needlessly created within. Dog mess disposal is the responsibility of the dog owner NOT other residents. Now, we clearly have a major problem which needs addressing and the dog owners who are responsible for the problem seem to have no intention of behaving reasonably. One day recently there were 7 separate dog faeces along the short section of Church Road pavement between the top end of St Felix Rise and the turning with Abbey Road. Apparently, the Glebe Meadow is also being contaminated.

East Suffolk Council do have a statutory responsibility for dealing with issues such as this so there are two actions residents can take.

The first is to phone their helpline (listed on their website) to report dog fouling. They say that they normally aim to remove the mess within 24 hours. The response time and intention is good BUT isn't it really bad that taxpayers should have to fund lazy people living amongst them?

The second option (a better one) is to get evidence and provide it to East Suffolk Environmental Protection Team.



They moved to France in 2007 and spent many happy years in The Limousin, Roger still working with new friends. Sad news is that Roger passed away suddenly, mid August. As a fireman, Roger earned a bravery commendation for saving the lives of a mother and her two children. As a person, we will remember his fun loving spirit.

FLIXTON LAKE PATH

The Parish Council, for several months, in conjunction with our local County Councillor Judy Cloke, have tried to retain this path for the Flixton residents.

There has been correspondence and meetings with Planning and Development SCC, Definitive Map Rights of Way Officers, Managers from CEMEX, the Planning Manager for Breeden and members of the Management Team for the Roma Estate.

Unfortunately because the path was classed as permissive in the original extraction plan neither the Parish Council, County Council or CEMEX can insist that the Roma Estate continue the paths existence once the lake is transferred to them. This is imminent and the Estate are adamant that they do not wish to keep the path open. Unfortunately there is nothing further that can be done. The Parish Council feel as I am sure you do that the Village has been poorly served.

NORFOLK & SUFFOLK AVIATION MUSEUM

Plans for the museum

During mid 2022 the museum was informed

by executors that we had been selected as a

recipient of a legacy from the estate of the late Peter Hinsley.

Car parking at the museum has long been a problem. Primarily day to day as cars need to travel the length of the museum through visitors on foot exploring the aircraft outside and themed buildings in the grounds. On very busy days, such as East Coast Pirates visits to the museum in May and our own Family Fun Day, both the car park and the field we use, with kind permission from Emma Gilham, have become full. We are aware that cars turned away can, and do, park in the village causing nuisance to residents.

In addition the museum has one, single track, route in and out of the museum causing congestion. Visitors parking on the field must also navigate the busy road in front of The Buck Inn pub. To relieve this the trustees of the museum contacted the owner of Flixton Hall to negotiate the purchase of a section of the woodland adjacent to the museum, plus a section of the field mentioned above from Emma Gilham. Both negotiations were successful with assistance from Nicholas Rudge of Durrants in Beccles, and John Hays of Sprake and Kingsley solicitors. The museum now owns both of these tracts of land. The intention is to use the woodland, much of which has already been cleared due to Ash dieback disease as the “normal” car park and the section of field as an exit route plus overflow car park. This will entail creating a separate exit from the field directly onto the road.

This will roughly double the on-site parking and drastically reduce traffic flow past the Buck Inn as this will be mostly one way, although Coaches and Lorries won't be able to use the woodland route. The intention is to retain a screen of trees between the woodland car park and the road, thus continuing the screening of the museum from the road. The overflow car park will only be used rarely on very busy days.

We also have plans to create two new buildings which will allow visitors to access the shop and café directly from the car park without need to access the rest of the museum. It will also improve facilities within the museum. The space no longer needed for car parking on site will facilitate this expansion. Once again it is the intention that none of this will be visible from the road.

There will also be direct access to the Adair Walk nature trail from the car park. All of this will require a large injection of money. The museum has funds to kick start this, plus there is the remainder of the legacy from Peter Hinsley. These funds will be used to seed a grant application to the National Lottery and other grant giving bodies. There is also a requirement for planning permission, doubtless this will take time. Thus exciting times are ahead for the museum, we hope that you approve, we are seeking to reduce our impact on the village. We do note, though, that changes will not be obvious immediately.

We will aim to keep you up to date as things hopefully progress.


